Reviewer comment (excerpt from decision email):

"The proposal is relevant to the track's collaborative-governance agenda, and the concept of reciprocal labour-market legibility, with evidence maps produced by accredited retired reviewers, is genuinely original."

The reviewer also recommended condensing the design safeguards, foregrounding the central research question, clarifying the cross-national mapping, and explaining what supports the claimed design gap; the review closed with: "I am looking forward to reading your final paper."

Submission summary from review

The review describes the paper as asking how public employment services can convert first-time entrants' work samples into credible employer signals under generative AI, using a collaborative-governance model in which accredited retired professionals produce evidence maps. It maps programmes in Germany, France, and South Korea onto a shared policy sequence and argues that public administration should govern reciprocal legibility rather than certify candidate quality.
